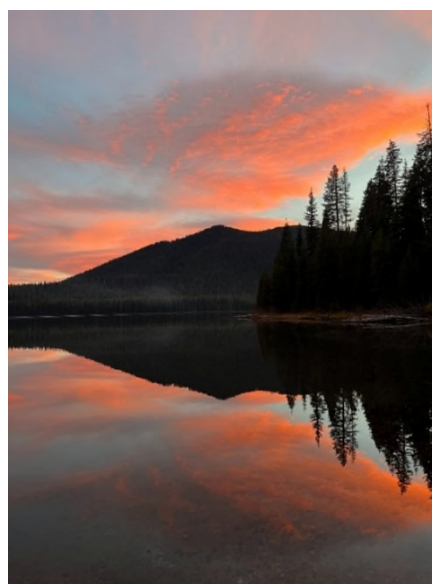

Member Profile

Ken Baldwin

A Journey into Fly Fishing and the Santa Lucia Fly Fishers

My path into fly fishing has been anything but traditional. Growing up in Southern California, my experience with fishing was limited to occasional surf casting off the rocks of the Palos Verdes Peninsula and jetty of King Harbor in Redondo Beach for opaleye and mackerel. It was enjoyable at the time, but eventually I drifted away from it as life moved forward.

Fishing didn't return to my life in a meaningful way until 1982, after I moved to the Central Coast. An acquaintance invited me to try fly fishing—something I knew little about—and that single invitation changed everything. Wanting to learn more, I signed up for a four-day introductory course at Clearwater Lodge on the legendary Hat Creek, one of California's premier fly-fishing waters. Those four days drew me in completely. Clearwater became a place to return to year after year, not only for the fishing but for the satisfaction of reconnecting with old friends and making new ones on the rivers and streams of Northern California.

Before long, the adventures extended far beyond the state. Clearwater-sponsored trips opened the door to casting for brown trout in New Zealand, stalking bonefish on the flats of Christmas Island, battling tarpon in the Yucatán, pursuing big rainbows in Patagonia, and swinging flies for steelhead on the Kispiox in British Columbia. Each destination offered not just new fish, but shared memories with people whose passion for fly fishing matched my own.

When I retired from my surgical practice in 2017, I joined the Santa Lucia Fly Fishers to stay connected to the sport and the kind of people it attracts. The club has strengthened my appreciation for both the waters we fish and the friendships that grow from them. For the past three years, I've had the privilege of serving on the Board of Directors, giving back to an organization that continues to make fly fishing not just a pastime, but a meaningful and ending part of my life.

Club Treasurer Position Needs to be Filled for 2026

Treasurer's Duties for Santa Lucia Fly Fishers

Keep track of all Club income and expenses

Work with Woo Commerce, Square and Quicken to document Club income and expenses.

-Woo Commerce

via the club website where members pay for dues, and event tickets. Finalize transactions, keep track of analytics for producing monthly financial statements.

-Square

Application that tracks all web based income and user fees.

Square analytics is used in producing Monthly financial statements. Square device used to take Credit cards at Banquet.

-Quicken

Quicken is directly linked to the Club business bank account.

Working knowledge of quicken to track income and expenses.

Quicken reports are used to produce monthly statements and to produce the quarterly reports for audits.

Quarterly Reconcile Bank and Quicken.

Treasurer's financial Notebook must be maintained with deposit receipts and expenditure receipts. Included in the notebook is a list of yearly speaker schedule (generated by others) with speaker fee amounts and addresses where payment can be sent.

Income

Track all income via woo commerce, checks, and cash; for dues, event tickets, silent auction, meeting raffles. Make bank deposits of checks and raffle cash.

Attend the monthly meetings in person when a meeting raffle is occurring to sell raffle tickets, handle cash and help select raffle winners. Sell club swag (hats) at meetings and banquet. Oversee banquet expenses, sales via square, income and accounting.

Expenses

Track all expenses including monthly auto pay expenses, quarterly expenses paid via check, annual donations, refunds, reimbursements requests, silent auction item purchases. Handle payments to guides and donations to non-profits.

Update the Board of directors on Financial health of the Club.

Monthly Financial Statement presented to the board of directors. This is currently in the form of an excel spreadsheet.

Provide the board with budget information for annual Club donations to other selected non-profits. End of the year short presentation to the general membership outlining overall financial health of the club.

File 501c7 non-profit paperwork with California Secretary of State. Online Annually File Taxes Form 990-N online with simple postcard (annual club income info needed for filing).

Keep the Treasurer procedures outline and all passwords safe. Help transition new treasurer when handing over accounts and financial notebooks from past years.

Hope to see more of you at our 2026 meetings.

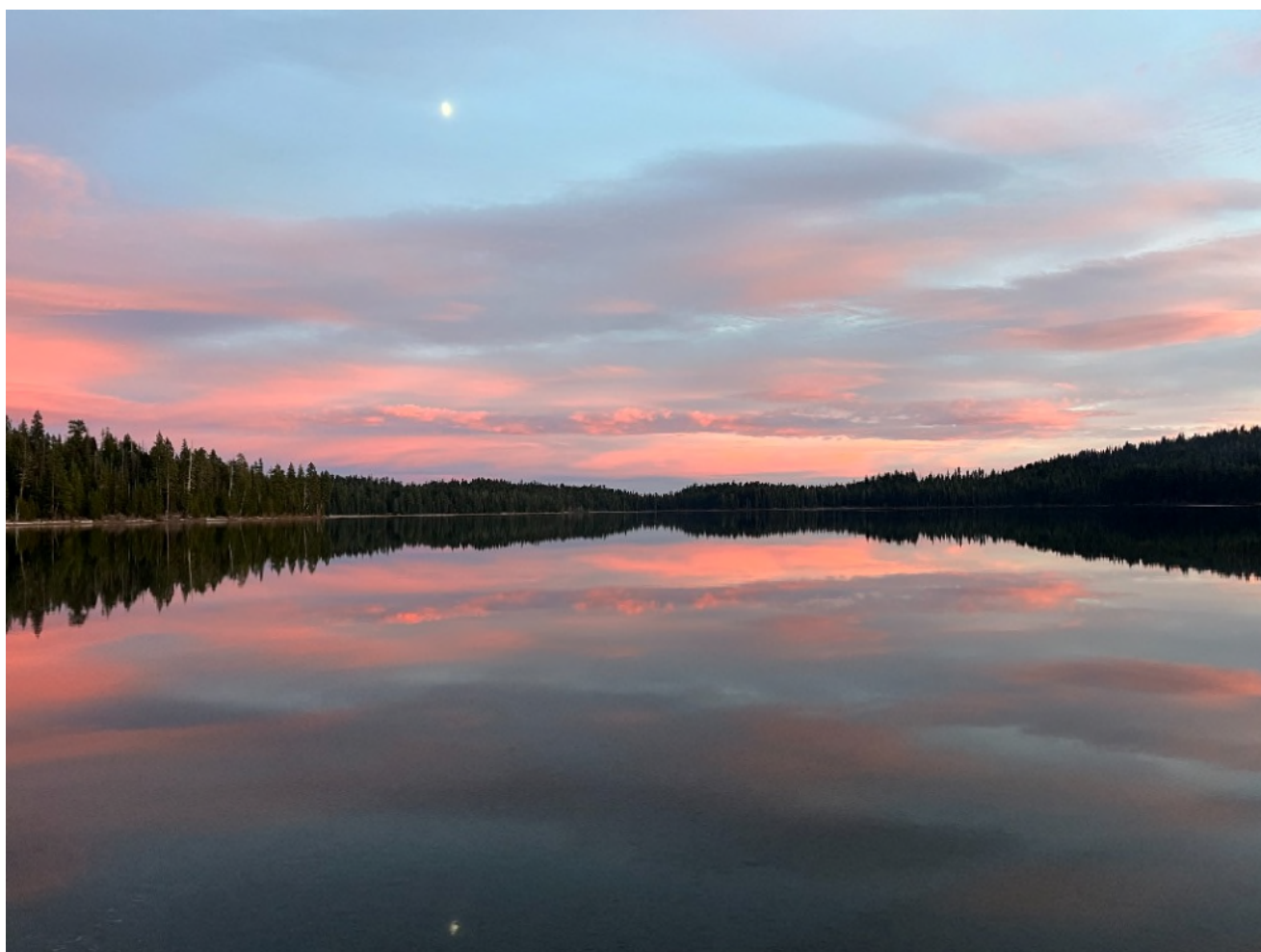
Santa Luca Fly Fishers Donations – 2025

California Trout	Cal Trout's mission is to protect and restore wild trout, salmon, steelhead and their waters throughout California.	
Casting for Recovery	The mission of Casting for Recovery® is to enhance the quality of life of women with breast cancer through a unique retreat program that combines breast cancer education and peer support with the therapeutic sport of fly fishing.

O' Neill Forebay Striper Trip

December 7-8, tentative (high winds postpone)

Leader: Mark Shelton (459-7863; mshelton@calpoly.edu)

What: Fishing for mostly schoolie, some larger striped bass, with the occasional largemouth or smallmouth bass thrown in. The O' Neill lake record striper is 59 lbs., so you never know!

How: Float tubes, pontoon boats, kayaks, wading, power boats all work. Stripping streamers like clousers, Lee Haskin's San Luis Smelt, zonkers, deceivers, and flashtail whistlers on I-lines or sink-tip/full-sink lines works best. Topwater action can occasionally be good in low light (poppers, gurglers, etc.). Rod/line size 6-8 is best, but lighter and heavier gear works. Stripers aren't leader shy, so 6 or so feet of 12-15 lb. mono leader is good. I use fluoro, but doubt it matters. The forebay ranger station opens at sunrise, usually about 6:30 a.m. in fall. Wind can be bad, so I'll watch the wind info line and keep in touch with interested folks. There are flats on the west and south end of O'Neill that are easily waded and can hold quite a few stripers. The nearby big lake (San Luis Reservoir) is good for power boats and is another option.

Where: Just west of I-5 by Santa Nella, 3 hours north of SLO.

Lodging: Some folks like to camp at the lake (Medeiros area is popular); most stay in Motel 6 very near the forebay (I've found it surprisingly clean in previous stays). Motel 6 Santa Nella/Los Banos: 28821 Gonzaga Rd., 3 miles west of I-5. Ph. (209) 827-8700.

When: I'll head up Sunday and fish that afternoon and Monday, returning home that eve.

Sunday Dinner: Our club tradition is to meet for dinner the first night at the **Woolgrower's Restaurant** in Los Banos – **6:00 p.m.** This is a family style, Basque joint that is a unique and fun place. It's almost worth the trip to eat here.

JANUARY 31 and FEBRUARY 7th

"Our goal is to make you a better and more complete fly fisher "

Casting your line is the most important part of fly fishing that a lot of us have to work on, that can MAKE or BREAK YOUR DAY. Your grade in succeeding at catching fish, at and having an enjoyable and relaxing time depend substantially on your ABILITY or INABILITY to deliver consistently solid, well-presented casts, in a variety of different fishing situations.

You may ask yourself this simple straightforward question: am I satisfied (enough) with my fly-casting performance as the kind of fly fisher I am now, or want to become?

For more than 30 years we have reached out. through our club casting clinics, to members who want to become better casters. A lot of you have answered the call, and benefited substantially from the clinics, bringing their hobby to a significantly higher level. Don't miss this great opportunity. Come to the clinics to improve and fine tune your casting skills, to reach your goal of becoming a better and more complete fly fisher. You'll be glad you did!

The casting clinics are conducted in a relaxing, non-competitive environment by your club's FFI certified casting instructors team, Sally Stoner, Debby Cox, Todd Tosse, Bob Hurd, and Bernard Pieters. The clinics are for club members only AT NO COST!

WHEN: Saturday January 31 ,and February 7th (plus a replacement day 2 /21.
WHERE: Laguna Lake Park ,San Luis Obispo (by the restrooms).
SIGN IN TIME: 8:45 to 9:20 am.
GROUP FORMATION: 9:20 to 9:30 am.
CASTING TIME: 9:30 to 11:30 am .
WHAT TO BRING: 4 to 8 wt rod with floating line,7 to 9 ft leader+ yarn, and NO sink lines
NOTE: if you need a rod, ask Bernard in advance

The programs are geared to each individual group, from new to the sport to advanced level.

JANUARY CASTING PROGRAM

We work on a variety of casting mechanics, and spring tune up. This session is a must, and a major stepping-stone for the next clinic.

FEBRUARY CASTING PROGRAM

Some casting mechanics part two and a variety of presentation casts and partly focus on distance casts.

NOTE: The program can be different from group to group.

The beginning level groups will be totally focused on learning the fundamentals of the casting mechanics that are needed to make a good cast.

Some of the intermediate groups will be expanding the mechanics to be able to bring your cast to a higher level. This group will also work on different presentations, as well as accuracy and distance casts.

Due to high demand (and limited spots available) it's advisable to sign up as early as possible for the clinics to secure your spot for one or two sessions plus one extra rain day 2/21.
